General Matters

1. School Operating Hours during School Holidays

The school library will be opened throughout the school holidays to provide students with a conducive place for self-study. The opening hours of the school library during school holidays will be from 8.00am to 5.00pm, on Mondays to Fridays. As part of safe management measures, students will be required to sit in fixed examination-style seating. Students are to register through their Year Heads so that they can be accounted for should there be an emergency, as well as for contact tracing purposes.

2. Attire and Grooming during the School Holidays

Students are expected to be properly attired with appropriate grooming when they return to school for bridging and remedial sessions, co-curricular activities (CCA) or other activities. For lessons, students are expected to be in school uniform/polo t-shirt, school shoes and socks. For CCA, students may wear their CCA attire or t-shirts, school pants/skirts, school shoes and socks. If students are not properly attired or their hair is not of acceptable length and colour, they will be sent home to rectify the problem before they can return for CCA or other school activities.

3. 2021 Booklist and Sale of Books & Uniforms

In view of COVID-19, we strongly encourage students and parents to purchase textbooks and school uniforms online to mitigate the risk of close physical contact. Here are the URLs of the online stores of the textbooks and school uniform suppliers and other relevant information:

Nonetheless, to cater to all families' needs, the school will continue to conduct sale of textbooks and school uniforms in school, with adjustments made to incorporate safe management measures including:

- Employing SafeEntry for check-in and-out of the school premises to facilitate contact tracing;
- Putting in place safe management measures such as wearing of masks, temperature screening at the point of entry and safe-distancing; and
- Managing the number of visitors in school by allocating specific time slots for students and parents to purchase textbooks and school uniforms so as to prevent mass congregation at the sale venues.

The schedule for the different levels and classes will be made available together with the school booklist as well as on the school website. This separate Information Sheet "Sale of School Uniforms, Textbooks & Purchase of Sports Shoes" will be issued to your child/ward on Thursday, 22 October. The information can be found in Annex A.

4. Update on School Sports Shoes 2021

With effect from January 2021, students will be allowed to wear sports shoes in place of the current black shoes with yellow shoe laces. The change is made after extensive review in consultation with teachers, students, alumni and parents.

This initiative by our Student Council aims to enhance student well-being as sports shoes are better able to support the range of physical and sporting activities at the secondary level and offer better cushioning (as compared to black canvas shoes) to minimise potential injuries. The durability of sports shoes will also save cost in the long run.

To empower students with choice and flexibility, students can purchase their sports shoes from any retail store in adherence to the following guidelines:

- ONLY sports shoes suitable for running and physical activities are allowed;
- High-cut, neon-coloured and/or shoes with motifs are not allowed; and
- Sports shoes must be fastened by shoe laces for support and safety. Slip-ons are not allowed.

Do note that students are welcome to continue wearing their current school shoes until such a time when a replacement is required due to wear and tear. Sports shoes will be provided as part of the MOE-FAS provision through our current shoe vendor.

Students will also no longer be required to wear the school socks. Only plain white socks that are easily available at retail stores are allowed.

Further details (including examples of shoes that are / are not acceptable) will be included in the Information Sheet "Sale of School Uniforms, Textbooks & Purchase of Sports Shoes" as well as the 2021 Student Handbook for reference.

5. Reporting Time for First Day of School in 2021

Students will report back to school on **Monday, 4 January 2021**. They must be seated in their classroom by **8.20am** for Secondary 3 and 4 students, and by **8.30am** for Secondary 2 students. They will need to be properly attired and groomed. Students are reminded to bring a book for silent reading prior to the start of morning assembly.

6. Travel Declaration

Students who intend to travel during the holidays will need to declare their travel plans. Regarding "Cruises to Nowhere," parents are <u>not required</u> to submit any travel declaration as cruises are not considered overseas travel if there is no port of call (Note: If there is any port of call, then it will be considered overseas travel). Even so, we would like students or parents to keep the school informed via CMs or YHs so that the school is aware and can contact students and parents concerned accordingly should there be a change in the situation. We seek

7. Holiday Academic Programme – Sec 3 Bridging / Remedial

As mentioned in our last termly information sheet, there will be a bridging programme and remedial sessions conducted for Secondary 3 students from Monday, 26 October to Friday, 4 November 2020.

Secondary 3 Express

All students will be required to attend a bridging programme from 26 October to 4 November, from 8.00am to 1.30pm daily. The bridging timetable has been issued to your child/ward and it can be found in Annex B of this term letter. Remedial sessions will be conducted for selected students from 26 October to 30 October. These students will be notified by their subject teachers. The remedial schedule is as follows:

Secondary 3 Normal (Academic)

All students will be required to attend remedial sessions for English Language and Mother Tongue Language from 26 October to 30 October. Students offering SBB English Language will continue to have scheduled lessons from 26 October to 4 November.

Selected students will be required to attend remedial sessions for the other subjects. The schedule can be found in Annex B. These students will be notified by their subject teachers.

Secondary 3 Normal (Technical)

There will be English Language and Mathematics remedial sessions conducted for selected students from 26 to 30 October. The schedule can be found in Annex B. These students will be notified by their subject teachers.

8. Holiday Homework

Please refer to the link under 'Announcements' on the school website for details of assigned holiday homework. A consolidated list will be made available for download from Friday, 23 October 2020.

In line with our school's Homework Policy, these learning assignments aim to help our students consolidate their knowledge and skills during the holidays, as well as take ownership over their learning and develop good study habits. Our policy balances the amount of homework given with ample time for students to pursue other holistic interests and bond with their family/friends during the holidays.

9. Co-curricular Activities (CCA) Sessions

Some CCAs will conduct meetings and training sessions during the school holidays in preparation for national competitions which will be resuming from January 2021. The respective CCA teachers-in-charge will be notifying members (and their parents) of the holiday training schedule through a *Letter of Notification*.

10. Secondary 2 Aspiring Leaders' Training Programme

The full day training programme will be held on Wednesday, 11 November 2020 for selected Secondary 2 students who have shown potential to take on leadership appointments at Secondary 3 in 2021. Secondary 2 Leaders from the Student Council will have an additional training session on Friday, 13 November 2020. Specific details will be provided to the selected students and their parents for this programme.

11. 2021 Level Camp Dates

Our annual Level Camps, which had been suspended this year due to COVID-19, are scheduled to be held from 25 January 2021 to 29 January 2021. The Level Camps are currently planned to be non-residential camps. Further information will be shared by the respective Camp ICs when school reopens next year.

12. Edusave Awards

Edusave Awards are given by the government annually to Singaporean students to enhance educational opportunities and motivate students to excel in schools in academic and non-academic domains. The categories of Edusave Awards are:

- Edusave Character Award (ECHA)
- Edusave Awards for Achievement, Good Leadership & Service (EAGLES)
- Edusave Scholarship (ES)
- Edusave Merit Bursary (EMB)
- Edusave Good Progress Award (GPA)

Awardees of ECHA, EAGLES, ES and GPA will be notified by post by December 2020.

Students who are eligible to apply for the EMB will receive an application form by post in late November. If your monthly household income does not exceed \$6,900 (or per capita income does not exceed \$1,725), you can complete the application form and submit the form to the community centre/club nearest to your residence, by early December. Successful applicants will be notified by post.

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13. MOE Financial Assistance Scheme

On arrival in school, please proceed to the General Office to obtain the 'in-principle approval' document before proceeding to obtain the textbooks, uniforms and sports shoes.
