15th Anniversary Honours Day 2021

The school's Honours Day will be held on **Friday, 16 April 2021** to recognise our students' and the school's achievements in the past year, as well as the tremendous support we have received from our partners and stakeholders. The theme of this year's Honours Day is **Our Home, Our Pride**, as we also take the opportunity to celebrate 15 years of excellence. Highlights of the 15th Anniversary Honours Day include the launch of Cohort Ambassadors who will reach to the different cohorts of graduates and the launch of our refreshed school website. The newly recognised Cohort Ambassadors will also place symbolic school items (e.g. Greendale shoelaces, Greendale socks) into our on-site time-capsule that will be revealed at our 25th Anniversary celebrations. Given the COVID-19 situation, we are unable to invite parents to join us in celebrating this event in school. We will explore possible avenues and platforms to share the joyous event with parents and stakeholders, including sharing with you the facebook/youtube 'live' web-link.

The ceremony will commence at 10.30am. All students will attend lessons as per normal until 10.30am and join the ceremony online in their respective classes thereafter. Students will be dismissed as per usual Fridays at 12.30pm. Students will have light refreshments in their respective classrooms as part of the celebrations.

Strategic Thrust 1 Learning

3. Teaching & Learning Updates

Over the March school holiday, the students would have engaged themselves in meaningful holiday homework. The school emphasises that "the aim of homework is to encourage and support students' learning. It is to allow students to demonstrate mastery of the concepts taught in class so that teachers can utilise the information to plan for future lessons. Homework allows students to take ownership of their learning and inculcate good study habits." Please refer to our school website for more details on our Homework Policy. The school will also put up information on assigned holiday homework at the end of each school term.

Parents and students will receive their first Progress Report Card for 2021 in the first week of Term 2. This will constitute 10-15% of the overall score for Secondary 1 to 3 students (see Student Handbook for details). Students are encouraged to identify and work on their strengths as well as areas of growth with their respective subject teachers for continuous improvement.

Selected students who have not performed up to expectations in Term 1 will be supported with remediation. They will be required to attend the remedial programme, starting **Monday, 22 March 2021**. Similarly students who do not perform up to expectations in Term 2 and in the Mid-Year

Examination will be required to attend the remediation programme between **Tuesday**, **1 June 2021** and **Tuesday**, **8 June 2021**. The selected students will be informed of the remediation schedule by their respective subject teachers.

We will work closely with parents to help our students learn and grow. We aim to focus on the student's holistic development, especially building resilience (including self-discipline as well as managing and overcoming setbacks) and, nurturing a growth mind-set, and not just academic outcomes alone.

4. Secondary 4 & 5 Academic Matters

The school has planned the following programmes for our graduating students as we work together with them towards achieving excellence. Attendance for the academic programmes is COMPULSORY. We appreciate your support in partnering with the school to help your child achieve academic excellence at the GCE 'O' and 'N' Level Examinations.

Extended Academic Programme (EAP)

The purpose of the EAP is to give all graduating students more time to prepare for their National Examination under the supervision and guidance of the teachers. This will prepare the students for the rigour of the examinations and help them face the national examinations with confidence.

All lessons will be conducted after school between **Monday, 5 April 2021** and **Tuesday, 27 April 2021**. Please refer to the attached schedule (Annex) for details.

June Academic Programme

The school has a June Academic Programme schedule planned for all Secondary 4E/5NA students. Selected Secondary 4NA students who are unable to meet their learning goals for the Mid-Year Examinations will be required to attend a Remediation Programme.

All lessons will be conducted between Tuesday, 2 June 2021 and Tuesday, 8 June 2021.

All 4E, 4NA and 5N students are also required to sit for Timed Practices for English and Mathematics. This is to provide them with an important opportunity to perform under timed conditions similar to the National Examinations. Students are expected to do revision over the June holidays. Targeted feedback and intervention strategies will be given to the students during lessons when school reopens.

The English Timed Practice will be conducted on **Tuesday**, **8 June 2021** 1.30pm - 6pm (similar to National Examination condition) and the Mathematics Timed Practice will be conducted on **Friday**, **25 June 2021** 8am- 10am (4NA) and 8am- 1030am (4E/SNA). More information will be given to the students at a later date through their respective subject teachers.

Coursework Preparation for Art and Design & Technology (D&T)

The coursework requires your child to produce a quality piece of work over the course of the academic year. The national deadline for submission is in Term 3. The coursework examination also requires a significant amount of preparation, a time-plan outlining the various stages of the coursework and their respective deadlines. Timelines will be issued to your child by their respective subject teachers. The school places great importance on the students' adherence to the stipulated timelines. This is to ensure that students give themselves adequate time to prepare and meet the rigorous requirements of coursework submission for the national examination.

Students are strongly advised to adhere to the timeline given for every stage of the coursework. Early completion before the deadline will also ensure that they can better prepare for other academic subjects

5. Mid-Year Examination for Secondary 2, 4/5 students

The mid-year examination (written papers) will be conducted from **Tuesday**, **4 May 2021** to **Tuesday**, **11 May 2021**. Secondary 4/5 students taking the O-Level Mother Tongue Languages Examinations will start their mid-year examination with English and Mother Tongue Languages papers earlier on **Thursday**, **29 April 2021**.

The detailed examination timetable and circular listing the topics to be examined will be uploaded onto the school website soon. We encourage parents to work with your child/ward to put in place a regular revision schedule leading up to the examination. Please work with the school to monitor your child/ward's physical and emotional well-being and provide them with encouragement and support.

All CCA activities for Secondary 2 & 4/5 will be suspended from **Term 2 Week 6** onwards; Secondary 2 students will start their CCA activities after the examinations. CCA activities will continue for Secondary 1 & 3 students during this period. However, there will be adjustments made to the frequency of the activities. More details will be shared closer to the dates through their CCA teachers.

Students need not attend school on Marking Day on **Wednesday**, **12 May 2021**. Lessons will resume on **Friday**, **14 May 2021** as 13 May 2021 is Hari Raya Puasa Holiday.

6. Post-Examination Activities & Innovation Week

The Post-Examination Activities & Innovation Week for Secondary 1 to 3 students will be held from Friday, 21 May 2021 to Thursday 27 May 2021.

This week focuses on Curriculum Innovation (CI) within different subject areas. The objectives are to enhance our students' knowledge and understanding through experiential learning and to help them relate what they have learnt in their subject disciplines to the real world.

Students will follow the usual reporting and dismissal time, unless otherwise stated.

Strategic Thrust 2 Well-Being

7. Discipline Update

As per usual school practice, the school conducts regular grooming checks to ensure that our students are appropriately attired and ready for learning. Term 2's grooming checks will be conducted in Weeks 1 and 6, as reflected in the Student Handbook. Students who are unable to adhere to school grooming rules will either be sent home, or will have their grooming rectified on-the-spot (e.g. purchasing proper socks, cutting nails). Parents and students may refer to the Student Handbook for school rules related to grooming.

In addition, we would like to draw parents' attention to the recent Straits Times headline 'Rise in vaping trend in Singapore sparks worry' (28 February). The article mentioned that a growing number of students are trying out vaping, even though it is illegal in Singapore. In line with Singapore's laws, we would like to stress that as a school we adopt a zero tolerance stand on vaping. Students found vaping, or in possession of a vaporizer/ vaporizer juice, will have to face consequences ranging from caning to suspension, and will have their case lodged officially with the Health Sciences Authority (HAS). 8. Co-Curricular Activities (CCA) Update

Please be informed that CCA sessions will continue as per Term 1. Despite the cancellation of National School Games, students will continue to hone their interests and talents as well as develop their social skills, leadership and character.

In addition, please note that Secondary 4/5 students, except students involved in SYF preparation would have stood down from CCA at the end of Term 1. Secondary 2 students will stand down from CCA from **Monday, 26 April 2021** in preparation for Mid-Year Exams. Secondary 1 and 3 students will continue with their CCA training until the end of Term 2.

To ensure the safety of all students and staff, **no public audience** will be admitted to the SYF Arts Presentation this year. Instead, live streaming details will be shared on the school website closer to the respective performance dates. We would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents for your continued partnership and support for your child as he/she showcases his/her diverse artistic talent and creativity in these challenging circumstances.

9. Secondary 2 Meet-The-Parents (MTP) Session

The Secondary 2 MTP will be held on **Friday, 26 March 2021**. Due to the current safe management measures, the session will be conducted via Zoom Webinar. Log-in details on the webinar will be shared with parents of all Secondary 2 students separately. Parents can expect to find out more about post-secondary pathways, subjects offered at Secondary 3 2022 as well as reminders on assessment details through the session. As this is a critical platform for the school to communicate with you on matters that will directly impact your child, parents are strongly encouraged to attend the session together with your child.

10. Mid-Year Meet-The-Parents (MTP) Session

The mid-year MTP session scheduled on **Friday, 28 May 2021** will be carried out for selected students and their parents via video conferencing by default. Should it be necessary, a limited number of face-to-face sessions will be arranged beforehand, with safe management measures such as SafeEntry check-in, temperature screening, minimising intermingling between groups, safe distancing and sanitisation.

To safeguard the health of our staff and students, kindly note that only parents/guardians with confirmed appointments will be allowed into the school premises. Parents/guardians with appointments who are

unwell or have family members who are unwell (e.g. flu-like symptoms, taken swab test & etc.) should not come to school; they are most welcome to reschedule their appointments with our teachers.

11. Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Immunisation Programme for Secondary 1, 2 & 4 Girls

As mentioned in the Term Letter 01/2021, there will be two doses of the vaccination for the girls. Please note the following schedule of vaccination:

The Secondary 1 girls will have their second dose of vaccination taken in the following year.

Strategic Thrust 3 Sustainability and Development

12. Distribution of TraceTogether Tokens

On **Wednesday**, **10** February **2021**, a notification was sent via Parents Gateway (PG) to inform parents that the school would be facilitating the distribution of TraceTogether Tokens to students who have not collected the TraceTogether Tokens. Parents were requested to respond to the notification by **Monday**, **22** February **2021** if their child required a token. The school is pleased to share that the TraceTogether Token will be distributed to students concerned from **Friday**, **26 March 2021**.

13. Reminders on Road Safety

The school would like to emphasise the importance of road safety and remind all students to be responsible road users and adopt good road safety practices. Parents and students are encouraged to visit the Singapore Road Safety Council website for tips on pedestrian and general road safety (http://www.srsc.org.sg/pedestrian.html). Here are a few safety tips for parents and students to note:

- Do not jaywalk. Always use pedestrian crossings like overhead bridges, zebra crossings, underpasses and traffic signal lights. Apply kerb drill when crossing (look left, look right again, and cross only when there is no vehicle or when the vehicle has stopped).
- Do not play or use electronic gadgets (especially mobile phones) when walking along footpaths or crossing roads. Always be attentive and alert.
- Use footpaths and other walkways whenever possible. If there is no footpath, walk in a single
 file and keep close to the side of the road facing the traffic whenever possible. And when using
 shared path, always stay alert and look out for bicycles and PMDs.

The school would also like to remind students who are walking to school from the direction of Punggol Central (vicinity of Horizon Primary School) to enter the school via Side Gate 2 (located behind the school canteen). This is to avoid having to cross the main gate where the traffic is heavy during the morning peak hour. And for parents who are driving, we request that you slow down your vehicle when approaching the main gate (entering or leaving). Thank you for your co-operation.

14. Student Leaders Investiture 2021

Each year, the school holds this ceremony to formally recognise incoming Student Councillors, Sports Leaders and CCA Leaders as well as to thank the outgoing student leaders for their service to the school. previous years where parents are invited to witness this event. Instead, we will be holding a closed-door ceremony on **Friday**, **26 March 2021** as part of our CCE programme during curriculum time.

Nevertheless, we hope you can join us to acknowledge the efforts and growth of the outgoing Student Leaders as well as to spur them to refocus their efforts on other challenges ahead of them.
